Ms. Abramowitz's Counselor's Corner

Attention Sixth Grade Parents:

All sixth grade students have been learning about anger and anger management coping skills during their weekly PE class. The goal of this program is to help your student learn coping skills so that they are able to manage their anger appropriately. This eight-week program has reached its half way mark and students have had their first quiz. To help students study vocabulary words, EDMODO has a link to the group and to Quizlet vocabulary words. There, students can practice their vocabulary through different flashcard games. If a student does not have access to EDMODO at home, handouts are provided with the words they need to know.

Students have already learned what the difference is between normal and problem anger, the anger rules, what are triggers and physical signs of anger. Next, they will be learning about the anger sequence, rational and irrational beliefs and how good communication skills will help with anger issues. They will also develop their own coping skills plan for them to practice. At the end of the course, students will bring home their completed folders for you to see. There will be one more test that will cover vocabulary and material learned during the eight weeks. A grade will be given for this course through Coach Henry.
