SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY REPORTING APP

QUICKLY AND EASILY SUBMIT A TIP

By accessing FortifyFL, students can provide a description of the threat, share pics and videos and optionally submit their contact information.

Anonymous or Non-Anonymous

You decide whether you want to include your name and contact information.

Convenient

Submitting a tip is quick and easy using our mobile app or website.

Include Photos and Video

You can also include photos or video with your tip report.

QUICKLY SEND TO AUTHORITIES

FortifyFL automatically routes your tip report to the appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials.



Your School Officials

The tip report goes to your local school officials when submitted.

Local Law Enforcement

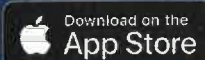
Your local police department or sheriff office receive copies of your tips automatically.

State-Level Officials

State-level officials also have access to your tips to make sure proper steps are taken.

FortifyFL is a suspicious activity reporting tool that allows you to instantly relay information to appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials. FortifyFL was created and funded by the 2018 Florida Legislature as part of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Act.

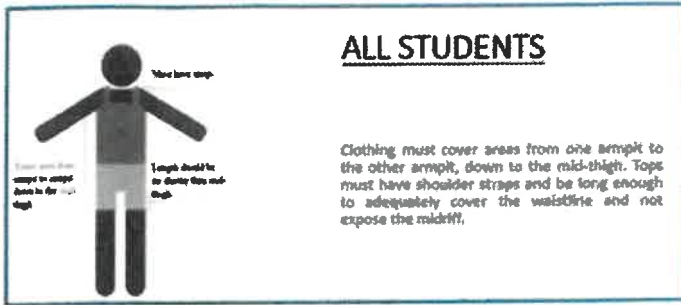

Dress Code Policy



ALL STUDENTS

Clothing must cover areas from one armpit to the other armpit, down to the mid-thigh. Tops must have shoulder straps and be long enough to adequately cover the waistline and not expose the midriff.

Reminders

- Clothing, piercings and accessories displaying profanity, violence, discriminatory messages, sexually suggestive phrases, symbols or phrases of alcohol, tobacco or drugs is unacceptable.
- Pajamas shall not be worn as exterior clothing on campus.
- Head gear, including but not limited to caps, hats, bandanas, and/or sunglasses should not be worn indoors.
- Students must wear shoes that are safe for the learning environment. Bedroom slippers are prohibited.
- Rips or tears in clothing above the mid-thigh must not expose skin.

Phone Policy

Expectation: Upon entering a classroom or office, phones will be put away and earbuds will be removed to assist students in maintaining academic focus.



Students MAY NOT
use phones when...

- In classrooms or offices
- In bathrooms or clinic
- During summative, district or state testing (this includes wearing smart watches)

Students MAY
use phones when...

- In the hallway between classes
- During breakfast/lunch times
- In the classroom if using for educational purposes as directed by the teacher

Recording other students and staff is PROHIBITED

Failure to put phone away after teacher reminder will result in discipline consequences including confiscation of the device or loss of privilege to possess such a device on school campus as outlined in the Student Code of Conduct.

When there is reasonable suspicion that a student has used a cell phone in violation of the Code of Conduct or other school rules, or for an unlawful purpose, the school administration may search the phone's call logs, voice messages, text messages, photographs and any other applications in its investigation of the suspected violations.

SELF-AWARENESS & SELF-MANAGEMENT

What is self-awareness and self-management?

Self-awareness and self-management means to understand and govern our thoughts, actions and impact on others.

As your child gets older, he or she will continue to develop self-awareness and self-management skills by recognizing how one's thoughts and ideas influence choices and impact others.

In grades nine through twelve, children begin:

- ✓ Implementing strategies and monitoring progress in achieving personal goals.
- ✓ Demonstrating behavior that respects the needs of others.
- ✓ Creating a plan to attain a personal goal that addresses strengths, needs and risks.

Below are ways you can help your child learn, practice and demonstrate self-awareness and self-management skills:

DISCUSS AN EXAMPLE

Discuss a time when you disagreed with someone and how you adjusted your behavior to understand the other person's point of view. For example, when you had a disagreement with a friend or coworker and he or she was not able to see your perspective. How did you approach the situation?

WORK TO DEVELOP GOALS

Work with your child to develop short and long-term personal goals. The goals should be measurable and achievable. Later, have them reflect on the process, his or her progress and how self-awareness and self-management helped them reach these goals.

BY GAINING SELF-AWARENESS AND LEARNING SELF-MANAGEMENT, YOUR CHILD WILL TAKE AN ACTIVE ROLE IN MONITORING AND ADAPTING HIS OR HER BEHAVIOR.

SKILLS TO CONSIDER PRACTICING WITH YOUR CHILD:



Formulating an effective long-term plan to achieve a personal or future professional goal.



Evaluating strategies that assist with managing challenges or setbacks.
